## Imagine the World as a Bubble

This project explores the idea of the world being something very fragile that needs a vast amount of respect and care. Considering how we are all responsible for the world's well-being, we would devise a playground game like a giant snakes and ladders that would be chalked onto the playground and up the walls. This would have squares marked with statements collected from the children that

move you forwards or backwards according to how friendly they were for the world, eg: "I walk to school" or "I want to plant a tree" would move you forwards several spaces, and "I leave all the lights on" would move you back several spaces. There could be "make a promise" squares, and these promises should be recorded in a prominent place in the school.

## Outcomes

- Increased understanding of the importance of treating our world carefully
- Increased awareness of responsibilities and the impact of our actions
- Increased awareness of simple things we are able to do ourselves which will have a positive impact
- Humanising and personalising the vast issue of climate change and breaking it down into something relevant and manageable for the pupils
